
# Latest population estimate

The latest population estimate (for 30 June 2014) shows that there are 528,200 people living in Bradford District, an increase of 1,800 people since June 2013. The population consists of 260,300 men (49.3%) and 267,900 women (50.7%).

Bradford is the fourth largest local authority in England in terms of population (after Birmingham, Leeds and Sheffield). Manchester is the fifth largest local authority.


## Population change 2013-2014

The District's population has increased by 1,800 (0.3%) since 2013. The increase is largely due to "natural change" – there have been around 3,800 more births than deaths although this has been balanced by a larger number of people leaving Bradford to live in other parts of the UK than coming to live here and a lower number of international migrants.



#### Population change 2004-2014

The District's population has increased by 43,500 (9.0%) since 2004. From 2004 until 2011 there was a steady growth of around 1% each year, but since 2012 the rate of increase has declined to around 0.3%. This is due to a number of causes – lower numbers of births, more people leaving Bradford for other parts of the UK than coming to live here and lower numbers of international migrants.



### Population by gender and five year age groups 2014

The population pyramid shows that the largest populations are for children aged 0 - 4 and 5 - 9 which reflects a national trend. There has also been an increase in life expectancy for both men and women in the district.
